Accessibility Checklist for Online Courses



Use this checklist to review your course content for compliance with <u>WCAG 2.1 AA</u> standards, as required by the ADA. While following these guidelines does not guarantee that your course will meet every individual student's accessibility needs, it will significantly reduce the likelihood of last-minute changes once a student with a disability enrolls. (Note: This does not cover all requirements of WCAG 2.1 AA, only those most relevant to online course content.)

Course uses consistent structure and navigation
Names of modules, folders, assignments, etc. are descriptive
Images have alt text
Pre-recorded videos are captioned
Real time captions available for live video
Videos have audio descriptions if needed
Audio-only files have transcripts
Instructions and information do not rely on color
Descriptive links are used
Color contrast between text and background is at least 4.5:1
Color contrast between non-text elements is at least 3:1
Avoid images of text (except for logos)
All documents (Word, pdf, Powerpoint, etc.) have been reviewed for accessibility
Third party content (web sites, online videos, publisher content, etc.) has been
reviewed for accessibility
